

## **NEXT STEPS/QUESTIONS TO BE ANSWERED**

*You can do this in a Word document rather than handwriting. Please don't forget to include your name and the title of the artifact.*

List THREE inferences you can make about the artifact, so far. Don't worry about being wrong; it's okay to make educated guesses at this point!

After exploring the exhibit and learning a little bit about your object, what questions are you left with? You should have AT LEAST THREE questions.

How do you plan to research each of these questions?

From which historical society or organization is your artifact on loan? How can you reach out to this group?

What search terms can you use as you research the Web? (I.e. Williams School; New London independent school; co-ed high school, grades 7-12, Connecticut; etc.)

Find at least one primary document that could relate to your artifact. Write a short paragraph explaining the document, analyzing the document, and relating it to your artifact.

What aspects of the War of 1812 do you need to further research in order to enhance your understanding?

How will you go about your research? What sources will you investigate? Identify at least one source for each of the following categories:

- Website

- Subject Specific Encyclopedia (give the specific name of entry as well)

- ABC-Clio article

- iConn

- NoodleQuest

- Primary Document (other than the one above)
